We are once again offering a 4th/5th grade choir this school year at Walnut Elementary! Choir is open to ALL 4th and 5th grade students (no audition required) and is free of charge. We will be rehearsing every **Wednesday after school** from **1:30-2:15 pm** in the **MPR** starting **Wednesday, September 14**. Choir members will learn proper singing technique by rehearsing a varied repertoire of musical selections, and we hope to have them perform at school functions and other events throughout the year (a more detailed performance calendar will be sent out once choir rehearsals are under way!) This group is *separate* from the day time music classes, and participation is *voluntary*.

Students are required to attend all rehearsals if possible so that we can perform at our best as a group! However, if a student has a conflict with a rehearsal, please send me a note or email so that I can be aware of the absence. Students can miss up to **3 rehearsals** per semester (Sept-Dec, Jan-May) without an excuse. **After the 3rd absence, however, students will no longer be able to participate in choir for the school year.**
