



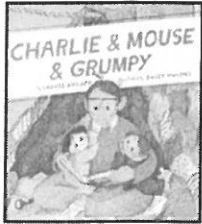

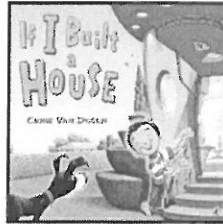

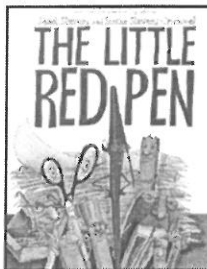
### If I Built a House By Chris Van Dusen

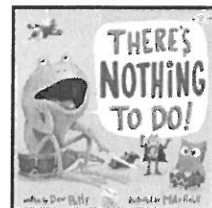
### The Little Red Pen By Janet Stevens

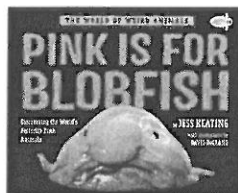
### Dog Man 7 For Whom the Ball Rolls By Dav Pilkey

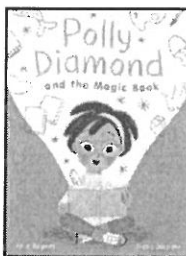
### Life According to Og the Frog By Betty Birney
